Class Preparation Instructions will be sent to your registered email after payment. It can be found in the Puppy Class Booklet that needs to be downloaded.

To socially prepare your puppy for stimulating environments before class read through the Socialization section in the Pup Start downloadable document.

Make sure you allow time for your puppy to acclimatize to a new environment. Especially if he/she does not enjoy car rides, meeting new people, dogs or is overstimulated in new situations.

Do not drag your puppy into class or allow your puppy to drag you into class, or drag you towards people or dogs. We will develop rules for on leash greetings.

Common areas will be sprayed with a sanitizer before and after class.

Allow space for the person in front of you to enter.

Find a chair or corner for your personal belongings.

If your puppy is sick and needs to stay at home, you should still attend class.

Classes should be attended by a consistent handler but if you cannot attend each class please ensure your replacement is informed of the class rules in Week 1. There is no time in class to catch up a new person to the pace of class.

Your puppy may need a potty break half way through class in the designated potty area. You are responsible for cleaning and picking up after your puppy.

Extra people in your family can join class.

Please do not disrupt the class by being late, using your cell phone or conversations with others while the instructor is teaching. This affects everyone in class. Questions are welcome in between instruction or after class.

Smoking- Please pick up your cigarette butts from outside the Day Care. Nicotine is toxic to dogs.

Puppies are also very attracted to marijuana! Many puppies have experienced toxicity after going to a park. Xylitol in gum is also very toxic. If your puppy appears drowsy or wobbly after a park visit please see your vet asap.

Please do not wear any perfume or cologne to class.
